The Radicalisation Awareness Network (RAN) is a network of frontline practitioners who work daily with both those vulnerable to radicalisation and those who have already been radicalised. Civil society representatives, social workers, youth workers, teachers, healthcare professionals, local authority representatives, police officers and prison officers are all engaged in both preventing and countering violent extremism in all its forms, and in rehabilitating and reintegrating violent extremists.

### **About**

RAN in the Western Balkans aims to support the prevention of radicalisation in the region and enhance synergies between EU and Western Balkans professionals. The project aims to map and bring together practitioners working in the Western Balkans, establish a pool of experts and organise meetings, workshops, webinars, trainings and study visits around relevant P/CVE themes so that professionals can exchange ideas and share good practices.


